The members of your Board of Directors feel strongly that moving our meetings to the new location is in the best interest of the group but we need some dedicated folks to help make it happen. 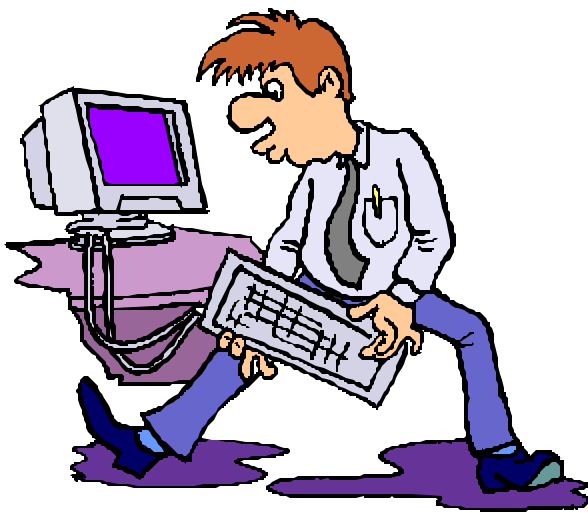
Prez Says continued:

Keystroke Magic for Non-coders

Yes, simple keystrokes can do amazing things. Jim Stiles of Wilson WindowWare will come to our General Meeting in March to show how keystroke macros can control any software-- only without fingers or mouse needed. The common denominators of Windows software are menus and keystrokes. When you see how easy it is to send menu items and keystrokes to any software, you will discover that if you know one macro method, you will be able to automate any software. Jim will be showing off the keystroke recorder in WinBatch. It turns keystrokes into written script anyone can edit. Making changes is easy without any re-recording needed. When the macro works the way you want it to, WinBatch makes it really easy to do it ten or 100 times more. This keystroke approach makes even Microsoft Office apps easy to automate. **As a special bonus:** Everyone at the meeting will get a free, and full, 12 months of WinBatch to use on their own PC. Macros can make your PC do more of the work.

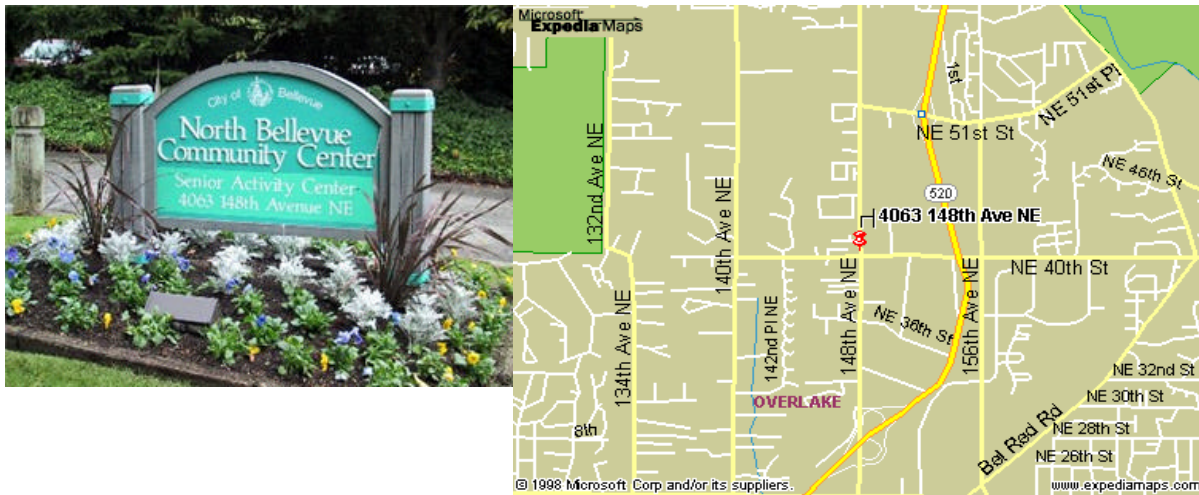
