Ah, March has arrived. Even though the weather is still wet and chilly, I am encouraged by the knowledge that spring is scheduled to arrive later this month. Of course, I have lived in the northern part of our great nation for enough of my life to know that spring does not always follow the calendar as we wish that it would. However, we have already seen some of the early flowers like daffodils poking their leaves out of the ground so there is hope for warmer, nicer days ahead. Also, remember that we "spring forward" on March 8th. Boy, that date is coming up quickly. We will lose an hour's worth of sleep on the 7th but gain more useful daylight hours in the afternoon through the summer. If your computer is a few years old, you may have to manually adjust the clock to Daylight Savings Time. As you may recall, the government changed the start and end dates for DST a few years ago and older BIOSes may not change automatically on the new dates.

I want to thank Phil Mark Davis and David Dodge for the two presentations that they gave during the General Meeting last month. Phil showed us an excellent way to re-wire the sound system so that sound from the presenter's laptop could be connected through the meeting room's sound system. Also, the pre-amp/mixer device that he demonstrated would give us more control over the volume of the various input sources at the front of the room rather than having to use the mixer board at the back. The members of the Board discussed the proposed changes and are evaluating the pre-amp/mixer method versus a cheaper method that might give us similar results.

David Dodge's presentation on recent advances in computer technology was also very interesting. I found the new, inexpensive Intel CPU that is designed for use in really small PCs especially interesting. It seemed to lend itself very well to those situations where one only needed limited power to do light office work and surf the net.

I have volunteered to give a presentation at the March meeting on our visit to the International Consumer Electronics Show in Las Vegas this past January. We saw some exciting new gadgets that I think you will find interesting. I hope to see you at the General Meeting on March 9th.

Have you renewed your KEGS membership for 2009? I hope so. According to our Treasurer, only fifty folks had renewed as of February 26th. That number represents quite a drop from where our membership was at the end of last year. I encourage you to renew your membership as soon as possible. We need your participation and interest.

During the February General Meeting, Bob Baxter went over the proposed guidelines that we will apply to better control items donated for the KEGaBuck\$ Auction. We greatly appreciate all of the items that are donated but don't want the Auction to become a disposal method for items that will not receive bids at the Auction. Here are the guidelines with the addition of printer information.

Software that runs on operating systems older than Windows 98SE will not be accepted. (We are considering changing the oldest acceptable Windows version to Windows 2000.)

No computer add-in cards that plug into an ISA bus will be accepted.

Donated items need to be complete enough to be easily used by the buyer. Each item should be in the original box if possible. If necessary, a substitute box may be used. Items that came with installation software and documentation should have those items in the box with the item.

Items that do not receive bids during the Auction will not be held over to the next Auction. Members who donate items are requested to put their names on the items and to take any items not receiving bids home with them at the end of the Auction.

Any PCs that are donated should be based on at least a Pentium III with a speed of 1 GHz or higher.

Printers must have drivers for Windows 98SE or newer operating systems. Also, ink or toner cartridges must still be available for purchase. A USB connection to the PC/laptop is preferred but not mandatory.

I recently discovered an unexpected compatibility problem on my PC that I would like to share with you. For some time, most of the knowledgeable folks in KEGS have been telling us that we can safely run two anti-spyware programs on our computers without any problem. (Not two anti-virus programs.) I have found that this is not always the case. For some time, I have been using Webroot's Spy Sweeper as my primary anti-spyware utility. It has gotten lots of good press and seemed to be doing a great job.

Then, a few weeks ago, I upgraded to Norton Internet Security 2009 to my PC. It seemed to work well for a couple of weeks but then my PC began to suffer from unexplained lockups from time to time. At first, I couldn't relate them to any particular action or recent change that I had made on the PC. Finally, I detected that the lockups seemed to occur right after Spy Sweeper loaded and when I tried to use Internet Explorer. As a test, I uninstalled Spy Sweeper and all of the problems disappeared. I guess this shows that not all anti-spyware programs can co-exist on a computer. Some can but not all of them. Be careful.
